### Interesting and historical courserelated facts

Monroe Golf Club officially opened on July 4, 1924, and was designed by Donald Ross. The club is built on inland glacial sand and moraine deposit, which provides incredible drainage throughout the property.

In 2007-2008, Monroe Golf Club underwent a restoration and tree project that included restoration of the original bunkers, restoration of the greens to their orginal shape and size, restoration of the fairways to their original mowing pattern and return of the original fairway bunkers, extension of championship tees and creation of chipping areas around the greens.
