Interesting and historical courserelated facts

Founded in 1898, the Atlanta Athletic Club outarew its former home downtown at its former East Lake property. The original downtown club was located on Edgewood Avenue and through the ages twice outgrew its space and relocated. The club added a golf course and country club at East Lake in 1915 and moved to the present Johns Creek location in the late 1960s. The club includes two championship golf courses, a nine-hole par 3 course, 42-000 sq.-ft. athletic center, indoor and outdoor tennis courts, Olympic-sized pool, club rooms and dining facilities. Every year since 2009 an independent survey group has ranked the Atlanta Athletic Club in the top 10 of country clubs in the United States.

Bobby Jones grew up playing golf at the Atlanta Athletic Club's East Lake Country Club, which the club built in 1906. Bobby Jones became the world's most famous amateur golfer and his career culminated with the Grand Slam of golf in 1930. He served as president of the Club and was an active member until his death in 1971.
