
- Mark Woodward, then GCSAA CEO, compared golf industry to the movie industry.

- Media does not do the same for rounds of golf played and revenue generated by the golf industry.


We Are Golf Coalition

Purpose of NE Golf Day

- Educate state leaders, media, other key figures on:
 - Human
 - Economic
 - Environmental
 - Health Benefits of Golf
- Allied Golf Associations join as a coalition
 - Speak with One voice about issues important to game of golf
 - Message of this coalition revolves around the 2 million US jobs generated by the multi-billion dollar golf industry

Fundraising

- Each year there are 1,000s of fundraising events held at golf facilities across the nation.
- Golf is directly responsible for raising approx.
 \$3.5 billion for charities.
- In NE, since 1996, the Cox Classic Golf Tournament has raised \$1.7 million.
- The NE Open will raise over \$900,000 in scholarships.




Human Impact

 There are 28.7 million golfers in the United States.

 The First Tee Program – impacts the lives of young people by providing learning facilities and educational programs that promote character-developing and life-enhancing values through the game of golf.

Health Impact

- According to a recent study, playing 18 holes of golf even while using a golf cart burns over 800 calories (see Neil Wolkodoff, Director of the Rose Center for Health & Sports Sciences)
- Golfers who walk 36 holes a week will burn around 2,900 calories per week which lowers their risk of heart disease, diabetes, and cancer (see Neil wolkodoff, Director of the Rose Center for Health & Sports Sciences)

Economic Impact

- The golf industry is responsible for 2 million jobs in the U.S.
- Total wage income of \$61 billion
- Total economic impact of golf in America in 2005, including direct, indirect, and induced impacts was \$195
- Golf industry is larger than performing arts and spectator sports and larger than motion picture and video business


Environmental Impact

- Golf course irrigation accounts for .5% of the 408 billion gallons of water used daily in the US
- Fewer than 15% of golf courses utilize municipal water supplies
- Golf courses are actively reducing maintained acreage and increasing natural habitats for wildlife
- Golf courses have an average of 11 acres of water bodies


