What are Politics?

- Any issue that is debatable and forces people to choose sides
- Relationships
- Information and communication

Internal Politics

- Issues and relationships within your club
- GM, Greens Committee, Golf Professional
- Example: golf course rules

External Politics

- Issues and relationships with those outside the staff of your club
- Members, guests and public course patrons
- Examples: course conditions and rules, aesthetics (i.e. trees, native, etc.), environmental concerns, pesticide applications

The Tree

- Problematic cottonwood on #1 tee at Victoria National
- In competition with tee box
- Littered the tee box
- Roots very destructive to mowers

The Solution

- Couldn't just cut it down
- Brought the GM's attention to the problem
- Plan of action
- USGA Report
- The perfect opportunity

- No fall out
- Keys to successful mission: gaining support and timing

Politics at Different Facilities

- Always a factor, regardless of type of facility
- The Victoria Tree issue would've been handled differently at a different course
- Varying degrees of politics at different types of facilities

Importance of Playing the Game

- Politics vs. Agronomic Skills
- Everyone knows agronomy, not everyone can play the political games

- Crucial to long term success
