- Bunkers surrounding green on #16 were renovated and relocated since last year.
- After the 2019 event, all greens were resurfaced to 777 bentgrass (previously A4 bentgrass).
- Other changes after 2019 included adjusting surfaces on a number of greens to create new hole locations on No. 8, 10, 13, 15, and 17; No. 4 green was moved to lock the surface into the pond.
