Additional Notes

- Bruce Hepner led a complete restoration of the golf course this year, which included new drainage, irrigation, green construction, grassing of greens, tees and fairways.
- The greens were put back the same with some additional pin locations added.
- Native areas were expanded.
- No. 11 and No. 18 had the most significant changes with all-new greens complex on 11 and additional bunkers down left side of 18 along with moving the greenside bunker closer to the green.
- Course received half of its average yearly rainfall in the last two months.
