- Last year's tournament was played over the July 4 weekend.
- Since last year's tournament 12 large trees were removed, including two behind No. 8 and one large tree right of No. 3 green. The trees were moved and replaced with younger saplings of preferred species to help with the backdrops of the holes and playability of the golf course.
- Area had severe drought in June and July.
 April had minor flooding of No. 15 and No.
 16 combined with 12" of snow the third week of April that brought down many trees.
