### Renovation Notes

Course re-opened in late January 2023. Bunkers were moved or added on every hole, greens were dropped in elevation or pushed right or left on every hole. Holes 10 and 18 were re-routed and now play in opposite directions than before. New forward tees were added to provide 7 tee placements on every hole.
