- Course had a rainy January and February.
- A microburst in July uprooted more than 80 trees and damaged 100s more. The cleanup was completed in December.
- · Course is Audubon certified.
- Wildlife on course include bobcats, coyotes, javelina, roadrunners, rattlesnakes, cardinals and vermillion flycatchers.
