Additional Notes

- Average fairway widths in landing areas are 25 yards.
- A cold snap in mid-January caused winter kill on some newly sodded trenches from new irrigation system installation project.
- Irrigation system included 21 miles of pipe and 1,350 sprinkler heads. It was finished in mid-October so some scarring from the process will be noticed.
- Founders Course superintendent Travis Cook was recognized as GCSAA's inaugural Emerging Leader Award recipient in January 2022.
