- The tournament front nine is Highlands #1-3, 13-18 and the back nine is Meadows 1-4, 13, 15-18.
- In early August the course received 15" of rain in 9 days, which led to flooding of the property. From the second week of August until late September, the course has only received 0.2" of rain, resulting in drought conditions. From Sept. 26 through Oct. 1 the course received 1.6" of rain.
