Notable

- The course was overseeded on Oct. 29 with perennial ryegrass, which is in a tight window to grow in the winter grass and prepare for this tournament.
- Only weather challenge this year was unseasonably low humidity at the beginning of the overseed establishment, which made keeping the seed moist a challenge.
- Past tournaments have been played with temperatures in the high 30s all the way up to high 80s.
- There is a planned greens renovation in 2026.
- An irrigation control project was completed in 2024.
- When not on the clock, maintenance team plays a lot of table tennis in the shop and conducts many staff tournaments.
