Notable

- Grainger hosts three professional events each year in the span of 13 weeks, with the PGA TOUR and LPGA events on the Gold Course.
- Routing includes normal holes No. 8-16 playing as No. 5-13 for the tournament. Also, normal holes No. 5-7 play as No. 14-16 for the tournament. This is to bring more of the final holes into a more manageable walking distance for spectators.
- The course is currently doing a multi-year full bunker renovation with 16 bunkers completed and eight more slated for summer of 2026.

- The course will begin a two-year complete irrigation system replacement. The Gold Course completed that process in 2024-25.
- Tiburon's Gold Course, which hosts PGA TOUR and LPGA events each year, was awarded the Celebration Bermuda Florida Golf Course of the Year for 2025.
- Land was formerly a tomato farm.
