Additional Notes

• The course has seen a number of changes since last year's event as part of the ongoing renovation plan. There are newly shaped and sodded greens and surrounds. Eighteen bunkers have been renovated and several tee boxes have been added.

• The in-house renovation is improvi9ng playing conditions and creating huge environmental savings on water and lower inputs to manage the course.

• Due to drought in the region, native grasses will be thinner than normal.

• Course is set in a sand dune habitat which makes for interesting topography and requires a variety of shots.
