Additional Notes

- The 9s are reversed for the tournament.
- There are 10 shuttle locations throughout the property to move players and caddies from hole to hole due to the layout of the course.
- Area has had an abnormally wet and cool spring creating a very high disease pressure.
- Staff maintains 120 acres of turf through the 520 acres of wetlands and hills of the Palouse.
- Circling Raven is owned and operated by the Coeur d'Alene Tribe.
- Superintendent Kal Zaranec is a part of the Nufarm EXCEL Leadership class. The program is run by the GCSAA and funded by Nufarm.
- Last year the No. 1 and No. 10 tees were renovated with the teeing surfaces combined. The putting green was also doubled in size from 6,000 sq. ft. to 12,000 sq. ft.
