Notable

- The Championship Course sits right next to the Potomac River. Both the Championship and Riverview courses were built in the floodplain, and land was used for farming prior to the golf courses.
- Changes to the course in the past year: the area surrounding the 18th green was expanded to allow better spectator observation.
- It's been a wet late winter and early spring, which makes it a little more challenging for the build out.
- Several acres of naturalized areas and protecting water bodies have been added. A vegetative buffer has been established around all water bodies.
