Water conservation, management and/or controls:

Street drains catch most of the run-off from the neighborhood, which flows to the irrigation pond at Pinnacle Country Club, as well as a direct feed form the water treatment facility across the street from the Pinnacle maintenance facility.

Muskrats; Great blue heron

Predominate species of trees on course:

Oak, Black walnut

Comments overheard about the course:

Players comment on how difficult the rough and water hazards are, and how the zoysiagrass rolloff areas around greens are so much different from other course designs in the area.

Significant changes recently made to the course:

Pinnacle Country Club moved the front greenside bunker away from the green on No. 2 to avoid the thinning of the collar and green from traffic and bunker shots.
