### Additional Notes

- The 18<sup>th</sup> hole features an island green. In 2009 Brittany Lincicome won the event with an eagle on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole – the only time in history one of golf's majors was won on the final hole with an eagle.
- The Dinah Shore course is one of three courses on the property (Arnold Palmer Signature Course – 1978 and Pete Dye Challenge Course – 1988).
- The facility includes a 17-acre driving range, 10,000 square foot chipping green, four putting greens and a multitude of practice bunkers.
