- Eleven holes border Lake Lewisville.
- The former sand bunkers on #11 have been sodded to grass bunkers due to rising water in Lake Lewisville.
- With the tournament in December, greens were overseeded and tees, fairways and approaches were painted.
- Preservation of the wildlife and resources surrounding the course were innate to the design. Native grasses, trees and plants are used in order to preserve water, as well as create intentional wildlife habitats.
