#### **Additional Notes**

• Approximately 30 of the volunteers on the maintenance crew this week are women from the turf industry.

• Narrowed right side of No. 2 fairway by 15 feet in landing area and right side of No. 14 fairway landing area by 18 feet. Reintroduced a low mow area to the left of No. 13 green. Widened No. 16 tee 15 feet to the right.

• Course has received just one fourth of usual winter rainfall, which allowed Flanagan and crew to prime the course, but also required earlier irrigation.
