Since 1926 the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) has been the top professional association for the men and women who manage golf courses in the United States and worldwide. From its headquarters in Lawrence, Kan., the association provides education, information and representation to 19,000 members in more than 78 countries. GCSAA's mission is to serve its members, advance their profession and improve communities through enjoyment, growth and vitality of the game of golf.

- Course has undergone significant upgrades in the past five years including substantial tree work, bunker renovations, and irrigation upgrades.
- Area has had a hot, dry summer for the climate.
- The 1960 design by A.V. Macan was the last championship course design in his career, which included courses in British Columbia, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and California and includes next week's Portland Classic at Columbia Edgewater Country Club.
- Course is situated on the traditional and ancestral lands of the Musqueam Indian Reserve.
- Cutthroat Creek is the last salmon spawning creek in Vancouver and work to remove invasive species along the bank have allowed Salmon to return to the golf course property and beyond.
- •The course is home to various species of wildlife and lush vegetation, including massive cedar and fir trees positioned along the banks of the Pacific Ocean.
- Wildlife on the course includes eagles, coyotes, salmon, otters, deer.
- The club has hosted four PGA TOUR Canadian Opens (1948, 1966, 2005, 2011) and one LPGA event (1969). With this event, Shaughnessy G&CC becomes the first course in Canada to host both PGA and LPGA Tour events in the 1900's and 2000's.
- The champions of the 2005 (Mark Calcavecchia) and 2011 (Sean O'Hair) PGA TOUR Canadian Opens shot just 5 and 4 under respectively.
- Tournament course records are 66 for women (Michiko Hattori) and 64 for men (Stephen Ames).
- The 2020 and 2021 CPKC Women's Opens were postponed due to the pandemic.
