#### **Notable**

- Changes to the course since last year including expanding No. 12 and 18 greens back to original design while re-grading the approaches to the greens; Resurfaced five tees; Changed grass lines slightly on multiple holes; Replaced concrete cart path and replaced with crushed shell waste area on No. 4; Resurfaced the member practice tee; Completed a full irrigation system replacement on Gold Course front nine and practice areas (the back nine and clubhouse areas were done in 2024).
- Upcoming work includes a multi-year full bunker renovation on the Black Course before doing the same on the Gold Course, as well as irrigation on Black Course next summer.

- Course just hosted the LPGA's CME Group Tour Championship, Nov. 20-23.
- The Facility also hosts the PGA TOUR Champions' Chubb Classic on its Black Course each February.
- Land was formerly a tomato farm, and plants sometimes pop up in native areas.
- Agronomy team member Steve Guasco leads the divots filling teams during the tour events and is referred to by the team as the "Director of Divots".
