Notable

- The course is the second shortest with the smallest greens played in the United States on the LPGA Tour so far this year (see notes on next pages).
- The 2020 renovation including restoring greens shapes and sizes to the original design, reshaping and aligning fairways, rebuilding all tees, rebuilding and redesigning all bunkers, adding internal drainage on all greens and expanding the practice green from 4,500 to 12,000 sq. ft.
- Before the 2024 event the No. 3 tee was moved to the right 25 yards to allow for a new range.
- The formal opening of the course in 1929 featured the foursome of Walter Hagen, Horton Smith, local golfer Morey Wells and the club's first professional, Nick Webber.
