- Holes No. 9 and No. 18 are flipped for the tournament.
- Spring saw wet and below average temperatures which resulted in slower grass transition from dormancy.
- Warmer temperatures, high evapotranspiration rates and less rainfall should aid in producing firmer, faster playing conditions.
- Wind will play a factor in difficulty of the golf course.
- The facility includes Fields Ranch West (designed by Beau Welling), The Swing (a lighted 10-hole par-3 short course) and The Dance Floor (a 2-acre putting course).
