Notable

- A March tornado took out 20 trees, including the signature oak tree on the right side of No. 1 fairway that shaped the hole.
- Course was 5" above normal rainfall for July and beginning of August, before very dry spell.
- Hot humid summer meant maintenance crew was in protection mode as low areas got ravaged with wet wilt. Recovery has been slow but is moving in the right direction.
- A sink hole formed in No. 9 fairway due to a crushed drain line.
- Land was a horse farm/pasture which was bought by the PGA TOUR to develop the area north of Cincinnati.
- Course hosted the Kroger Classic (2002-04), Korn Ferry's Chiquita Classic (2010-12) and PGA Junior Championship, an event won by Lexi Thompson, (2009).
