- Jeju Island is in a typhoon corridor and three typhoons provided about 56 inches of rain in a recent five week period, providing quite the challenge to prepare the golf course.
- The course features a number of revetted bunkers, black volcanic rock outcroppings and many views od the Hallasan Volcano.
- Great care is taken to protect the sensitive island environment. Much of the island is preservation area with no development. The course is committed to nature and aware of the impact on the surrounding environment.
