#### **Additional Notes**

- Biggest challenge leading up to the tournament was extremely wet December with 11" of rain, including seven inches Friday and Saturday after Christmas.
- Last summer all tee boxes and driving range tees were laser leveled.
- During the tee and driving range renovation in August, the Champion course received 16" of rain.
- Enviornmenal steps include an irrigation audit to better manage water usage and the use of organic fertilizer.
