Additional Notes

- Recent work includes shaving lake banks to water's edges to primary cut height on No. 10, 11, 14, 15 and re-establish edges on bunkers lined by native plants/grasses.
- Golf course is located just below 6,000 feet and it is not uncommon to have frost on the golf course every month of the summer. 50-degree temperature swings are also common with 30s in the morning and 80s in the afternoon. The average snowfall in Truckee is 205".
- Irrigation inputs have been reduced by 25% and an organic-based fertility program promotes sustainability.
