Additional Notes

• Winter weather is always a challenge in tournament preparation with low light conditions, slow turfgrass growth and generally wet weather.

• There have not been any major changes to the golf course from last year. There were 3.5 miles of drainage installed in approaches and professional tee boxes.

• The course was renovated in 2019 with all the greens rebuilt from the drainage up. New bunkers were added on No. 3, 5, 15, and 16.

• The leeward waters of Maui have the densest humpback whale population in the world during the winter months.
