Additional Notes

• Changes since last year's event include renovating #9 green complex and eliminating two of the bunkers and adding 750 square feet to #2 green.

• Tom Doak did a complete renovation of the course in 2019 (started in January and course opened in November).

• The renovation and redesign brought ravines and water into play and reduced the number of bunkers from 54 to 19.

• Memorial Park was originally a nine-hole course built in 1912 before being turned into an 18-hole course in 1936.

• Memorial Park hosted the PGA Tour's Houston Open 14 times between 1947-63.
