Additional Notes

- Changes to the course: No. 1 tournament tee raised 3 feet for better view of the hole; No. 10 left side fairway bunker extended 32 yards in total length; pine trees were added to right side of No. 14 green and behind No. 15 tee.

- There have been renovations to driving range and short game areas. Driving range was leveled, multiple target greens, bunkers and a fairway landing area added. Short game area has two new greens and added bunker space (including fairway bunker practice area).
