Additional Notes

- The area experienced one of the worst winters in terms of damage in recent history. Nearly 10 acres of tees and fairways had to be either re-sodded or grown back in from seed. The greens were saved by removing ice and snow throughout the winter.
- No. 13 pro tee was rebuilt, which doubled the overall teeing surface.
- In 2020 banks on water's edges on No. 10, 11, 14, 15 were shaved to primary cut height. Bunker edges were also reestablished where lined by native plants/grasses.
- Course is located just below 6,000 feet and it is not uncommon to have frost on the course every month of the summer and 50degree temperature swings (30s to 80s).
