Additional Notes

- Since last year the course underwent a comprehensive bunker renovation and competitive enhancement project. Bunkers were completely rebuilt with new grass surrounds, drainage, liners and sand, which also included reducing overall square footage by 30% and repositioning as needed to increase course strategy.
- Delayed start to growing season has challenged staff to complete grow in of areas impacted by bunker renovation, as well as prepare existing areas of the course for the tournament.
