Additional Notes

• Last year the course experienced one of the worst winters in terms of damage as nearly 10 acres of tees and fairways had to be re-sodded or grown back in.

• This year weather has been great with a late season snowfall providing much needed moisture. Course wintered well with help of 9 feet of snow for protection during weeks of Christmas and New Year's.

• Course is just below 6,000 feet and it is not uncommon to have frost every month of the summer and 50-degree temperature swings.

• In 2020 banks on water's edges on No. 10, 11, 14, 15 were shaved to primary cut height.
