Additional Notes

• Course Notes: Greens average 6,000 square feet... There are 57 bunkers on the course... Average fairway widths in landing areas are 25 yards wide.

• The tournament will be a composite of all three of the nine-hole courses on the property. The nines built in order are the Thompson, Homenuik and Knudson.

• The Black Creek runs throughout the property crossing through seven of the tournament holes.

• Since 2018 Ian Andrew has overseen renovation removing trees to open up views, restoring bunkers and altering Robinson's nine to make it more in line with Thompson's vision of the property.

• This is the first year the course has hosted this annual event, which will return in 2026.
