Additional Notes

- All greens were re-surfaced with Tifdwarf hybrid bermudagrass in the last two years, but are overseeded at this time of year.

- Weather was warm in November and December leading to great growing conditions and thicker than normal rough.

- A master tree plan removed more than 70 older trees and 132 date palms and added 90 new trees.
