Additional Notes

- The club is the oldest club in North America (founded in 1873) and is on its 3rd site.
- Renovation in 2004-05 including 17 greens re-designed, 70 bunkers rebuilt, tee boxes added, #12 went from par 3 to 5 and #13 went from par 5 to 3.
- Average fairway widths in landing areas: 26-30 yards.
- Course has renovated bunkers, narrowed the fairways and added additional length on 8 holes.
- August had 10" of rain with one flooding event which closed the course for a few days. Team has had difficulty mowing roughs because of rain.
- Facility is 45 holes.
- Environmental steps have included pesticide and water reduction and naturalizing unused areas of the property.
