Notable

- May was hot and humid, while June brought an unusual amount of rain (7"+) and forced many weather delays. The course drains well and there were no damaging storms.
- Amount of rain and thunderstorms delayed preparation with certain areas too wet to mow.
- Before the 2024 tournament, bunkers were rebuilt after a storm with 7" of rain washed out almost every bunker in September of 2023.
- Ahead of the 2024 tournament professional tees were expanded on No. 6, 7, 9, 14 and 17.
- A project removing Green Ash trees continues.
- The land was a sod farm before the golf course was built.
