Notable

- Renovation included rebuilding and resurfacing all 18 greens complexes, resurfacing tee boxes and upgrading portions of irrigation system.
- Green work recaptured square footage to allow for additional hole locations, while also returning the green surrounds to Zeon zoysiagrass for a firmer, better draining playing surface.
- Tees were resurfaced to improve year-round playing conditions.
- Course was lengthened by less than 50 yards for the tourn.
- Area has had a very wet year and the excessive rain made the renovation project challenging (53" of rain so far this year 56" all of 2024).
