Notable

- Changes to the course since last year include a small fairway reduction on No. 17 and a shortgrass expansion on the left side of No. 8 approach.
- Before the 2024 event the course was completely rebuilt from the ground up with turfgrass conversions, bunker placement and stream reclamation, etc... A 1949 aerial photo guided reshaping of fairways and greens. The restoration was committed to environmental stewardship. The maintenance team is adjusting agronomic practices with the soil changes.
