Additional Notes

- The renovation took place between 1999-2008 and restored all 18 greens and bunkers to their original 1929 design.
- Course transitioned from 100% potable water to 90% recycled water in 2017.
- 25 acres of irrigated turf was converted to native non-irrigated turf.
- 75 bird boxes and 10 owl boxes are monitored and maintained on the course.
- Facility was developed by Marion Hollins, who is being inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame this year.
