- A new 17<sup>th</sup> hole was created in 2019.
  There are new fairway bunkers on the left of No. 1 and right of No. 15.
- Edges of greens were taken out to provide more pin positions.

- Average fairway widths in landing areas are 32 yards.
- Course had a very dry start to the summer, but rain since the end of June has greened the course.
- Course mined 4,000 tons of sand from the dunes for bunkers, saving money and transport from quarries cutting down on carbon footprint.
- Course is Geo Certified.
- Wildlife on the course include the rare Natterjack toads, skylarks and foxes.
- Tournament routing is regular No. 17, 18, 1, 2, 3, etc...
- Royal Liverpool Golf Club member Matthew Jordan qualified for The Open.
