- Rolling Hills was managed by the City of Tempe since 1958. Grass Clippings began a 50-year lease in July 2023 to begin managing the property.
- Grassy Shop Opened (Winter 2024), New tee boxes on holes 1-11 (Spring 2024), Top Tracer Driving Range and Event Lawn (Summer 2024), Outdoor Bar and Event Lawn (Winter 2024), Restaurant (Spring 2025).
- The two 9-hole loops will be flipped, so the tournament will finish on hole 9 and play as hole 18 for the event. Hole 18 tee box will serve as the tee for hole #1 and #18 for tournament play.
- The Grass Clippings Rolling Hills Golf Course in Tempe, Ariz., has a rich history and an ambitious future. Initially opened around 1958, it has been a staple of the local golf community for decades. In a significant transformation, Grass Clippings, a company with a unique vision for golf through the perspective of the greenskeeper, has embarked on a 50-year lease of the property. Their mission is to elevate the venue into the premier executive golf course in the United States.

This transformation includes a substantial investment, with \$15 million allocated for renovations throughout 2024. These enhancements are set to make Grass Clippings Rolling Hills the first lighted 18-hole golf course in Arizona, signaling a new era for the facility. The introduction of lighting allows for extended play times, catering to golfers' schedules and promoting the sport's growth in the region.

Furthermore, the property is evolving into a full-scale entertainment venue. This development is not just about golf; it's about creating an experience that combines sport, leisure, and socializing, thereby broadening the appeal of the golf course.

A standout feature of this revamped facility is the establishment of the Grass League, the world's first high-stakes, par-3-focused golf league. This innovative league represents a significant evolution in the sport, offering a new competitive format that emphasizes skill and strategy in a condensed form of the game.

Grass Clippings Rolling Hills is set to become a landmark in the golfing world, blending tradition with modernity, and offering a comprehensive golfing and entertainment experience that is the first of its kind in Arizona.
