Notable

- The 2023 renovation included new bunkering, green adjustments and re-grassing, fairway expansions, re-grassing and re-design of tee complexes and approaches and a new irrigation system.
- The South Course started as a 9-hole, par-3 course called the Iron Duke. Recent renovations are modeled after courses in the Australian Sandbelt with bunkers scalloped into greens and fairways, and native fescue areas run right into fairway and tee height grasses.
- Cold winter, cool and wet spring and wet early summer has been tough lead up for warm season grasses.

- Course has added 100 acres of fine fescue native areas. That and more warm season grasses have both contributed to significant water reductions.
- Added aquatic plants to many ponds to help infuse oxygen and fight algae naturally.
- Created non-mowed buffers around many ponds to reduce nutrient leaching.
- Course has an ESD water recycling system in place.
