Responsibilities: As the Superintendent of Canterwood Golf & Country Club, a gated private housing community in Gig Harbor, WA, I have been tasked with the daily and long-term success of the golf course as well as the growth and development of my staff. This includes, but not limited to agronomic programming, staffing, training, irrigation, supporting equipment maintenance practices, capital project planning, budgeting (for club level and corporate initiatives) and financial forecasting. I guide all pesticide and fertilizer applications, oversee environmental initiatives, and work with my General Manager, the Regional Vice President, and the Senior Vice President of Agronomy, of Invited, to utilize our resources in the best ways possible.

> Along with the one hundred acres of golf course property, we maintain a half-acre practice facility, a multiple tee driving range, and range floor, a private event tee used for weddings and other celebrations along with green belt residential areas within Canterwood. I oversee special projects within the clubhouse grounds and its surrounding areas, and surveying and managing tree and shrub removal throughout our heavily forested tracks. I serve my membership of Canterwood as though it is not just an 18-hole golf course, but an extension of their homes since many of my members live right on the course itself. Throughout the seasons, I meet and confirm changes, and plans, with the local HOA office to ensure all residents and Canterwood Golf members have full use of our facilities.

I have served as a member of Task Groups, (Assistants Task Group, Scholar's Competition Task Group, Women's Task Group, Membership Appeals Task Group) the GCSAA PAC Board, and the Nominating Committee. Currently, I serve on the Western Washington Chapter Education Committee. This group guides educational opportunities and presentations to choose speakers/educators for chapter meetings and selects courses for the annual Washington Turf Landscape and Nursery Show.

Beginning in the Summer of 2025, I am implementing Canterwood Golf & Country Club's first Golf Course Maintenance Internship Program. Using resources through my colleagues and our parent company Invited, I have created a framework, duties, and benchmarks for our interns.

Since 2023, I have had the joy of presenting "Taking the Next Next Step" at the Toro Assistant Superintendent Experience in Minnesota. 500 WORD STATEMENT

From my youth of mowing lawns to becoming a Class A CGCS, my journey towards GCSAA has not been a common one.
