THE GCSAA CONFERENCE AND TRADE SHOW: The GCSAA Conference and Trade Show is presented by The Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA), presenting partners American Society of Golf Course Architects (ASGCA), Golf Course Builders Association of America (GCBAA), and United States Golf Association (USGA) and participating partners, National Golf Course Owners Association (NGCOA) and National Golf Foundation (NGF). It is the largest trade show in the golf course management industry.

PHOENIX: The GCSAA Conference and Trade Show returns to Phoenix for the first time since 1987. The show will be held at the Phoenix Convention Center, while the GCSAA Golf Championships will precede the show with events at Talking Stick Golf Club, Camelback Golf Club and Whirlwind Golf Club, January 27-29. While the show has not been in Phoenix since 1987, the golf championships were played here in 1991 (the show was in Las Vegas that year). Next year's GCSAA Conference and Trade Show is scheduled for San Diego, Calif., Feb. 1-6, 2025.

GCSAA LEADERSHIP: J. Rhett Evans is GCSAA's chief executive officer. Evans joined the GCSAA staff July 9, 2009, as chief operating officer and was promoted to CEO in January 2011. He is the eighth CEO in the history of the 98-year-old association, which was formed in 1926.

Kevin P. Breen, a certified golf course superintendent (CGCS) was elected as the association's 86th president at the annual meeting, Feb. 4, 2022. He was elected for a second one-year term last year and became just the fourth multiple-term president in association history and the first since 1947. The 32-year GCSAA member is the superintendent at La Rinconada Country Club, Los Gatos, Calif.

GCSAA ANNUAL MEETING: The 2023 annual meeting of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America is Thursday, Feb. 1, as part of the GCSAA Conference and Trade Show. The meeting features the election of a new board of directors. Jeff L. White, CGCS, director of agronomy at Indian Hills Country Club in Mission Hills, Kan., has been nominated to the office of president.

GCSAA AWARD WINNERS RECOGNIZED AT SUNRISE CELEBRATION

The Sunrise Celebration presented in partnership with Syngenta, takes place in North Ballroom 120 of the Convention Center, Wednesday, Jan. 31 at 8:30 a.m.

- Old Tom Morris Award Dottie Pepper, former LPGA Tour professional and current television broadcaster is the recipient of the 2024 Old Tom Morris Award from the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. The award has been presented annually since 1983 to an individual who, through a lifetime commitment to the game of golf, has helped to mold the welfare of the game in a manner and style exemplified by Old Tom Morris. Tom Morris, a fourtime British Open winner, was the longtime superintendent at St Andrews in Scotland until his death in 1908.
- Outstanding Contribution Award Tenia Workman, executive director of the Georgia GCSA, is the recipient of this award. The award is given to an individual who has made a significant contribution to the membership through outstanding contributions for the golf course industry.

SEND-OFF CELEBRATION: Presented in partnership with John Deere, the Send-Off Celebration takes place in the North Ballroom 120 of the Convention Center, Thursday, Feb. 1 at 3:15 p.m. The celebration includes results of the 30th annual Collegiate Turf Bowl competition, an introduction of the 2023 GCSAA Board of Directors, and recognition of the Col. John Morley Award for Distinguished Service, Presidential Award for Environmental Stewardship and the Emerging Leader Award recipients.

- Col. John Morley Award for Distinguished Service William "Bill" Murray, CGCS, retired, will
 be recognized. The award named for GCSAA's founder was revamped in 2021 and is now
 presented annually to an individual who is or has been a GCSAA Class A or B superintendent
 member and has made a significant contribution to the advancement of the golf course
 superintendent's profession.
- President's Award for Environmental Stewardship Wayne Mills, superintendent at La Cumbre Country Club in Santa Barbara, Calif., will be honored. This award is based on exceptional environmental contributions to the game of golf – contributions that exemplify the superintendent's image as a steward of the land.
- Emerging Leader Award Richard "Richie" Kremer from Connecticut will be recognized. The award was established in 2022 and recognizes a GCSAA member who displays continuous growth in service and leadership.

EDUCATION FOR SUPERINTENDENTS: The GCSAA Education Conference is the largest education event in the industry, covering all aspects of golf course management, including agronomics, environmental management, communication, leadership and business management. The event features more than 318 hours of education.

TURF BOWL FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS: The GCSAA Conference and Trade Show reaches students through the annual Collegiate Turf Bowl, presented in partnership with John Deere Golf, a highlight of the week for hundreds of future industry professionals who test their classroom and field knowledge as part of a team representing their schools. As of Jan. 2, 64 teams and 243 students from 28 different schools are competing. Penn State is the defending champion, winning its 5th title in the last 9 years and stopping Purdue's two-year winning streak. GCSAA GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS: The championships, presented in partnership with The Toro Co. for the 30th year, and benefiting the GCSAA Foundation, offer four different events over three days (Jan. 27-29) and draws members of all abilities. Competitions take place at Camelback Golf Club, Talking Stick Golf Club and Whirlwind Golf Club. The National Championship is a 36-hole, stroke-play at Camelback and features 72 GCSAA member with a 5.0 handicap index or lower. In total nearly 600 GCSAA members will participate in the events, which also include a scramble, four ball and classic. Dylan Foster of The Verandah Club in Fort Myers, Fla. Is the defending national champion.
